SGV-NCNW Salutes Judge Ketanji Brown Jackson - Supreme Court Nominee -

On February 25 President Biden nominated Judge Ketanji Brown Jackson as the first Black woman Supreme Court Justice. NCNW President Dr. Thelma Daley said, "President Biden's nominee to the Supreme Court is eminently qualified. Her stellar record as a public defender, service on the United States Sentencing Commission, her private practice and service as a federal judge underscore the wide range of her experiences. These experiences demonstrate her

commitment to fairness and excellence."

After several days of intense questioning at the confirmation hearings before the Senate Judiciary Committee Judge Jackson came through as the shining star/our shero that we are so proud of. Senator Corey Booker said in his remarks,

"And you did not get there because of some left-wing agenda," Booker said. "You didn't get here because of some 'dark money' groups. You got here how every Black woman in America who's gotten anywhere has done, by being, like Ginger Rogers said, 'I did everything Fred Astaire did, but backwards, in heels.' And so I'm just sitting here saying nobody's stealing my joy. Nobody is going to make me angry."

He recounted the life story of Harriet Tubman and told of how she looked up at the North Star as a harbinger of hope. **"Today you're my star," he told Jackson. "You are my harbinger of hope."**

In reference to the attacks from the opposition, Booker said, "But don't worry, my sister. Don't worry. God has got you. And how do I know that?" "Because you're here. And I know what it's taken for you to sit in that seat."

Our National organization sent several communications urging us to voice our support for Judge Jackson. We continue to pray for her and her family during the election process and look forward to her being seated as our first woman Black justice on the US Supreme Court. We can all agree with Dr. Daley that "The first black woman justice on the SCOTUS marks a long historic journey not only for black people, but for our wonderful country as a whole."

SGV and YWCA Collaboration

Each organization shared its programs focusing on youth programs. SGV Tutoring Program



The January 2022 school session got off to a great start with SGV-NCNW Young Legends Tutoring Program. Last year SGV partnered with California Institute of Technology (Caltech) to provide **Math tutoring to students in grade 1 - 12** primarily located in the San Gabriel Valley areas. We have 20 students receiving one-on-one online tutoring weekly. Caltech graduate and undergraduate students assigned by ASCIT provide tutoring. The program is designed to help students gain greater competency in Math foundations, improve skills in math, and ultimately prepare students for college-level math. SGV has received excellent service from Caltech and is proud of this collaboration which we hope to continue next school year. We are also looking at mentorship and programs for the summer.

Betty says


